
LEAVING SCHOOL: POST 16 DESTINATIONS

APPRENTICESHIPS

What is an apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is an actual job with training which allows young workers to earn while they learn, whilst gaining a nationally recognised qualification.











Apprenticeships have equivalent educational levels:

- Intermediate Level 2 equivalent to 5 GCSE passes at grades A*-C or 9-4
- Advanced Level 3 equivalent to 2 A level passes
- Higher Levels 4, 5, 6 and 7 equivalent to a foundation degree or above
- Degree Levels 6 and 7 equivalent to a Bachelor's or Master's degree.


Welcome to Arnewood Sixth! You are about to embark on a busy and important two years of sixth form study.
