IMPLEMENTATION

Almost all of our pupils join Arnewood with no previous experience of German. Consequently, we begin with the very basics and work from there. We start with a phonics focus to ensure students are recognise and accurately spell/pronounce key phonemes from the outset.

Spring 2	Theme 2 - Pupils will extend their holidays vocabulary knowledge to be able to talk about weather, recognising when to use a verb and adjective as well as different tenses. They will further consolidate and revise conditional tense structures and vocabulary to talk about their ideal holiday and recognise similarities in structure between the future and conditional tenses. Summer 1	Theme 3 - Pupils will develop vocabulary on the topic of daily routine to use reflexive verbs. 

Y9 Spring 2	Students will discuss their music and TV viewing preferences and habits as well as be able to describe a trip to the cinema. They will revisit the perfect tense and how to form past participles and correct word order. Additionally, they will revisit and expand their vocabulary on the topic of food and drink from year 8. Y9 Summer 1	Students will revisit the topic of sports and hobbies first covered in year 7 and be able to talk about how they spend their free time using adverbs of frequency and revisiting opinion structures. They will gain some cultural understanding on how German-speaking countries celebrate certain festivals and how that might differ to Britain. Y9 Summer 2	Students will begin Theme 2 of the AQA GCSE course where they study house and home. They will recap topic 1 from year 8 where they learned how to talk about their town but expand their knowledge to be able to use modal verbs accurately as well as prepositions with correct case endings to talk about the location of something. Half Term	Curriculum Focus	Landmark Assessment
Y10 Autumn 1	Students will continue to study Theme 2 of the AQA course and begin chapter 6 where charity/voluntary work is introduced. They will draw on their previous knowledge of healthy/unhealthy living from year 8 and be able to expand on this. They will recap grammar points including intensifiers/qualifiers, comparatives/superlatives, 'um Zu', modal verbs in the present and conditional tenses as well as 'als' in the past tense. Y10 Autumn 2	Students will study the topic of environment and be able to discuss what they do and should do to help protect it. Y12 Autumn	Students will begin to study the first topic 'Familie im Wandel' in which they will broaden their vocabulary on the topic of family and relationships covered at KS4 as well as begin the topic of 'Die digitale Welt' in which they will expand their vocabulary on the topic of social media and the internet. We will revisit the grammar topics of present tense verb conjugation of regular and irregular verbs and modal verbs as well as the perfect tense and correct word formation and genders of nouns. Y12 Autumn 2	Students will finish studying the topic of 'Die Digitale Welt' and begin 'Jugendkultur: Mode, Musik und Fernsehen' in which they learn about youth culture today. They will be familiar with some vocabulary related to music and TV genres from GCSE but we will broaden their vocabulary on this topic, in particular focusing on extended writing skills as well as reading and listening skills. In tandem we will recap correct pronoun usage (with cases too) as well as verbs which take specific cases. Y12 Spring 1	In this term we begin to study the course film 'Good Bye, Lenin!' in tandem with beginning the second theme's first topic 'Feste und Traditionen' which expands on the customs and celebrations topic covered at KS4. Students will learn how to recognise and use the passive with 'werden' as well as correct usage of separable and inseparable verbs and reflexive verbs.
