The Arnewood School warmly welcomed children and their families from community link schools and slightly further afield to Open Evening on Thursday 5th October. Teachers and students gave up their free time to share the Arnewood experience with visitors across all the departments.

The evening started with a welcome presentation from Mr Anderson and then students were on hand to provided guided tours to visitors.

The Drama and Music Departments featured rehearsals of the upcoming production "Our House" as well as engaging visitors with games of devising, trying a musical instrument, cane journeys and garage band.

The P.E. Department set up table tennis, and badminton in the gym and football and netball on the Astro, encouraging visitors or all ages to get involved and have a go.

The Science Department was as popular as ever demonstrating lasers, pH – acids and alkalis, a

rnewood Sixth student, Mackenzie De Caux demonstrated a rather impressive EPQ / AS project this term.

Mackenzie presented his project after school on Tuesday 3rd October 2023 where he revealed his robotic "K9" live in the classroom. This Dr Who inspired product has cost in the region of £300 to make and is over a metre wide. The robotic dog can move around, wag his tail and twitch his ears.



Mackenzie explains:

Taking a design originally conceived 46 years ago and using the known measurements of K9, the remaining unknowns were extrapolated using reference images and scale factor. Designs were drawn up in 2D CAD (Computer Aided Design) and laser cut out of 6mm MDF.

The dog was constructed with a mix of adhesive and fixings before seams were filled and sanded to high level finish for an even surface. K9 was then painted with a grey primer and moreover an automotive blue steel. Ears and tail were made from wire, the eye plate made from laser cut red acrylic. Electronic

were fitted for movement, the ears turn in sync and the tail wags.

The various features regulated by the Arduino, an open-source programable board are controlled by an IR sensor hidden beneath one of the buttons on the back control panel. A faux screen and logo were modelled in a 3D CAD program and then 3D printed. The collar is made from 10mm foam and Buchanan tartan.

K9's design is an amalgamation of the eight key variations he took during his 46-year history and appearance in over 30 episodes of Doctor Who and its associated spin offs.




Year 11s have had a busy and purposeful start to the year, continuing to prepare for the mock examinations in November as well as finding out more about post-16 options.

TUTOR ACTIVITIES

Our weekly tutor activities begin with target setting on a Monday morning, reviewing targets for the previous week and setting a SMART target for the week ahead. SMART targets are Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant and Time-based.



On Tuesday morning, students have access to computer suites and use Unifrog to find out about a variety of industries and careers, and the qualifications and skills they need to progress to different post-16 courses. On Wednesdays, we have focussed on exam preparation, completing a booklet on study skills and ways to revise. We have tried these out on Thursday mornings, when students have had extra time to focus on revision. Our Friday morning assemblies have supported this focus on post-16 options, with visitors from Brock and Totton College as well as assemblies on apprenticeships from Mr Price and the Arnewood Sixth from Mr Colman, Head of Sixth Form. Feedback from students shows they particularly value having a bit of extra time for revision in tutor times





At both evenings, Mr Emecz provided an overview of what is happening in school and how parents can keep informed using resources on Firefly.

YEAR 11 MOCK EXAM PREPARATIONS PAGE

The mock exam page on Firefly has been popular with both parents and students, and is regularly updated with links and resources to help Year 11s keep on top of exam preparation. Students and parents can see lists of what students should be revising. You should only see pages for the specific options that students are studying, as topic lists will vary for those taking higher or foundation maths, combined or triple science etc. There is also a range of revision planners that students can modify themselves, as well as copies of resources used in tutor times. I have also included a comprehensive 45 minute video, exclusive to Arnewood and not available elsewhere on the internet, that gives invaluable information from Lorraine Lee on parenting a student preparing for their examinations. This comes highly recommended by parents who have watched it, and includes a 'banana skins' section with advice on how to respond when your child says "I hate maths!", "You don't understand" and "I don't know where to start!".





REVISING OVER HALF TERM

When I wrote to you last term, I said "it is really important for students to look after their mental health, and one of the best ways is to spread the load by putting some extra time in now." Students who have left things to the last minute have been asking their tutors how much they should be revising over half term. Lorraine Lee gives advice in her video, and includes this template for a day's revision for a weekend/ holiday leading up to a period of exams. The important thing is for students to allow time for their brains to process the information they are revising. Encourage them to plan carefully and include breaks. Working for more than an hour without a proper break will not be effective, and they must factor in days off!



MOCK EXAMINATIONS TIMETABLE

PREPARING FOR EXAMINATIONS

GCSE examinations are scheduled to start week beginning Monday 6th May 2024, with the last timetabled exam currently on Wednesday 19th June. The contingency day for next summer's exams is Wednesday 26th June, which is the last day on which a GCSE exam can be held. Please do not book any holidays before this date.

The purpose of mock examinations is to allow students to experience what the examinations will be like to help them prepare for their formal exams next year. There are very strict rules in place during formal examinations, and as such students completing mock exams will be expected to follow all the rules and expectations that formal exams entail. Parents can support students by ensuring they know when each of their exams is taking place and where they need to go for their exams. It is really important that students get into good routines for eating, sleeping and keeping hydrated in the lead up to the exams. Keeping calm, being well-organised and getting into agreed routines can help students cope with the pressure of exams. If

students are worried about their exams, they should talk to their tutors and teachers in the first instance, but are always welcome to come to the Year 11 Office at break or lunch to talk to Mr Emecz. Head of Year, or Mrs Young, **Assistant Head** of Year.
